These people sound pretty incompetent. Obviously, they bring nothing to the table, do they? They may be hardworking, talented, industrious, and brilliant with a compelling understanding of emerging markets.....but if they can't ace the interview they might as not try, right?

They are lost causes... hopeless cases...dead end drifters...dark pits of despair... and captains of their individual *Titanic*.

In short, with interviewing skills like these, they can't do anything, say anything, or think anything that will help them out of their unemployed states. They have nothing to offer. And after a performance like that....*there's no one to speak for them either.*

Well friends, we may not have personally blown up in an interview. We may not have embarrassed ourselves in front of a prospective employer. And we may not have sacrificed a chance at a job on the altar of foolishness.

But we are exactly like them. In fact, God tells us so. Take a glance at these notes from God...

"All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

"The wages of sin is death." Romans 6:23

"There is none righteous, no not one." Romans 3:10

Uh oh. That's big trouble. We're all sunk, aren't we? If we have all sinned, and there is no one who is righteous, and the ultimate destination of our sin is a Godless death...we are much worse off than someone who is unemployable. It's over for us and we have no hope.

But wait.

"... if anyone does sin, we have One who speaks to the Father in our defense – Jesus Christ the Righteous One. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world." 1st John 2:1-2

World Cup – What is really going on?

Last month I was in South Africa - you could feel the anticipation in the country as the time was quickly approaching for the World Cup of Soccer. In America there isn't the same awareness of this event as there is in the rest of the world. When I lived in Europe, every, and I mean EVERY cafe, pizza joint, restaurant, and shop had televisions set up throughout the entire month of the World Cup. It was definitely a bigger event than the Olympics. As I walked around the Cape Town area of South Africa, I was well aware of all the preparation that was going on - last minute repairs were being made on roadways, the airports were sporting new terminals, food courts and mini-malls as they prepared to receive their world-wide guests. Children were playing soccer in the townships wearing their favorite team's jersey. Unfortunately, other preparations were taking place. Over 30,000 women and children were expected to be being brought in for slavery of various kinds during the games. Women who cannot even speak the language, who thought they were coming to waitress or do domestic work, will be forced into unthinkable acts of slavery.

Over the last few years a group from Youth With A Mission have been doing their own kind of preparation for the games. They have been going into the school system and warning children of the dangers that will come with the World Cup. The job offers that look too good to be true - really are, and the children need to be aware of what is really going on behind these job offers. This group has been working together with other organizations to prepare safe houses for those rescued out of these horrible situations. They have prepared tracts that teams are handing out that contain a crisis phone number to call for help. They helped to create a 24/7 prayer room, where people from around the world will come and pray for those being exploited, for the rescue efforts and the prosecution of the offenders.

God is aware of what is going on behind the scenes of the biggest events in the world. He calls His children to step in and make a difference - to be His hands, His love, His voice into very dark places. As you catch news about the World Cup in the next couple of weeks - please say a prayer for those battling the darkness that has invaded this international event.

... and by the way, these very same crimes are taking place in our own backyard. Please say a prayer for those working to fight the darkness in Atlantic City, Newark and New York City - God is also aware of these situations and He is calling His children to make a difference - more about that later!

Christmas in July



You are invited to be part of Christmas in July for the children served by ASELSI ministries in Chichicastenango, Guatemala. The last several years, ASELSI has given 2800 gift bags to their boys and girls 12 years old and younger during their Christmas celebration. **Each year our church provides over 900 of these bags!** Each bag is marked with the age group and gender of a child.

Required items for each bag:

- \$3 to cover shipping cost
- Baby comb/brush set (0 mo – 2 yrs)
- Over 2 yr boys: sturdy comb
- Over 2 yr girls: sturdy brush and comb
- Babywash for under 8 yrs old/bar soap for 8-12 yrs old
- No-Tear Shampoo (up to 8 yrs old), regular or no-tear shampoo (8-12 yrs), placed in separate zipper bag to prevent leaking
- Small stuffed animal
- Toothbrush and toothpaste (infant/youth size for 0 mo – 8 yrs, regular size for over 8 yrs of age)
- Washcloth



Generously fill bag with other items as space allows (see next page for suggestions by age.)

No candy or scary/violent toys, no reading books.

Message from Carol Angelo

To My Family, Friends and Loved Ones,

God has called me to Chichicastenango, Guatemala!

Not everyone is fortunate enough to have an extraordinary life changing experience. Last July, I traveled to Guatemala with a mission team from my church – Absecon UMC. I shared in washing the native children’s feet and fitted them with new socks and shoes, helped paint a house, visited a very poor Mayan family up in the mountains to take them food, worked in the medical clinic, and prayed with patients and their families. The week was very emotional, meaningful, and heartwarming for me. I truly felt God tugging at my soul.

Upon my return home I spent many hours praying, reflecting and talking with loved ones about this most recent mission trip. My prayer has been that, some day, God would ask me to serve Him on long term missionary work. The opportunity has come!

After being a nurse for 39 years, surviving breast cancer, and believing that God has been preparing me for many years for this journey, I applied to ASEL SI Ministries in the Quiche area of Guatemala as a volunteer Nurse Missionary. (Isaiah 6:8: *I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?” and I said, “Here am I. Send me!”*) ASEL SI Ministries is an established Christian Ministry that serves the desperately poor. Through healthcare and education, evangelism and prayer, the Love of God is spread to these gracious and beautiful people.

Word came in January that I had been accepted to become a member of the staff at ASEL SI Ministries for a 2 year term. I will be working as a nurse in the Father’s Heart Medical Clinic helping to care for the poor, providing ongoing health education, sharing the story of Christ, and praying with the people of Chichicastenango and those in surrounding areas. (Philippians 4:13: *I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.*)

The excitement is building and much preparation has taken place for my departure to Guatemala on July 21, 2010.

My new venture is totally volunteer. God has blessed me with so much and He is faithful, but in addition I need your support. I ask for your prayers, understanding, encouragement, love and contributions.

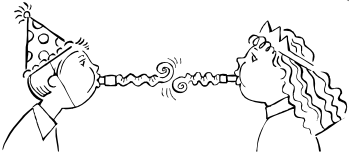
